Summary of Professional Experience	I am the Head of Ultrasound at the Repat Health Precinct, a public South Australian Medical Imaging site. In this role I'm fortunate to lead a great group of sonographers in the provision of general, obstetric, gynaecological, vascular and MSK ultrasound services. Our department is rapidly expanding to service the public's ultrasound needs, but I maintain a strong focus on sonographer wellbeing and providing support for staff to maintain a high standard of ultrasound, engage in research and train the next generation. Previous experience has included positions as a Specialist Sonographer at the Women's and Children's Hospital (specialising in paediatrics) and the Royal Adelaide Hospital (Adelaide's largest trauma centre).
