



Pru Pratten Memorial Lifetime Achievement Award Criteria

Category A – Service to ASA

- Presented original research or proffered paper at ASA scientific meeting (maximum 5)
- Invited speaker ASA Annual Conference and/or SIG
- Presenting at ASA educational events, asawebinars, Travelling Workshops
- Presenting at ASA Branch Meetings
- Annual Conference or SIG Convening Committee
- Member of the ASA Board of Directors
- Member of EAC, SPAC, Branch Committee, other external committee (max 4)
- *Sonography*: Editorial Committee (max 3)
- Sonography: Published (opinion piece or interesting case) (max 3)
- *Sonography*: Original article or research (lead author or co-author) (max 5)
- soundeffects news: Contribution of written work
- AFASA or FASA (2 points for AFASA with additional 3 points FASA max 4 pts)

Category B – Mentoring and training

- Lecture or tutor of ultrasound at an ASAR/NZMRTB accredited ultrasound training institution
- Actively involved in in-house sonographer training
- Involved in other professional ultrasound training (registrar, POCUS etc)
- Supervision of HDR research students (Masters or PhD) completing ultrasound research at a recognised tertiary institution (max 4)
- Examination of sonography students completing an accredited ultrasound course
- Clinical supervision of students enrolled in accredited ultrasound course (max 4)

Category C – Service to humanity and innovation

- Involved in ultrasound research designed to have a clinical impact on sonography practice and/or patient care
- Presenting own work/research at other professional association conferences
- Developed educational models specific to ultrasound and the advancement of sonographer training and/or education
- Volunteering Outreach to indigenous Australian/Maori and Pacific Islander communities scanning programs
- Volunteering Outreach to indigenous Australian/Maori and Pacific Islander communities Education of indigenous healthcare workers in ultrasound application or the utility of ultrasound
- Volunteering Outreach International communities scanning programs
- Volunteering Outreach International communities education of healthcare workers in ultrasound application or the utility of ultrasound
